

Facts & Figures...

Tanker Support 444 is a specialized water supply piece operated by the Hereford VFC located in Baltimore County, Maryland. The unit's primary function is as a drafting piece for use at ponds, streams, pools, and underground tanks. Its design allows for versatile use in tanker support operations.

The vehicle itself is a 1998 International 4x4 chassis with a 1000 gpm front-mount pump and a 500-gallon water tank. The rig was built by New Lexington Fire Equipment and carries 1500-feet of 4-inch hose and 500-feet of 3-inch supply hose. It is also equipped with a 250 gpm floating pump and a 12,000 lb winch.
