Engine Tanker 503 is equipped with a 1,750 gpm, single-stage Hale Q-Max pump and carries 1,200 ft of 5-inch LDH.

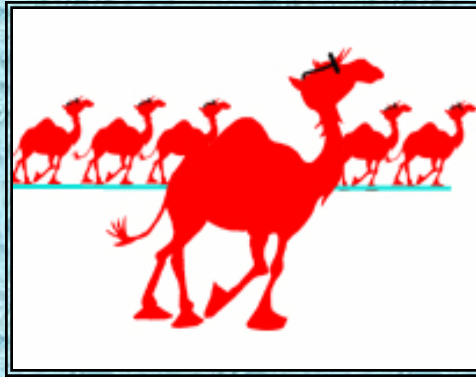
