Facts & Figures...

- Engine 4 is a 3000-gallon engine/tanker operated by the Phillips Fire Department located in Franklin County, Maine.
- The rig is a 2005, E-One engine/tanker built on an International chassis and has a poly tank.
- It is powered by an International motor and has a 1,000 gpm, two-stage Waterous pump; the rig also carries a 3,000-gallon dump tank.
- Engine 4 is another Franklin County rig that was purchased through the Federal grant process.

Phillips Engine 4



Engine 4 is set up to perform engine company work in addition to hauling water for tanker shuttle operations.

The rig is equipped with a 3,000-gallon dump tank and 20-foot of 6-inch suction hose. Engine 4 also has foam capabilities.

When shuttling water, Engine 4 can either dump through its 10-inch rear dump or through one of its 10-inch side dumps. The rig is also equipped with a 5-inch direct fill line.

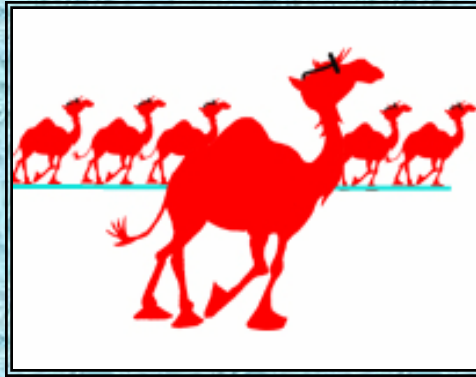


Shown here at a drill in Strong, Maine, Engine 4 sets up at the dump site and begins to supply water to the attack engine while the dump tanks are being put into position.

Engine 4 is shown here drafting through 2-1/2-inch suction hose to help increase its intake. Six-inch suction hose is already being used on the officer's side to take suction from another portable dump tank.
