Facts and Figures...

- Tanker 7 is a 1989 tanker operated by the Banksville Independent Fire Department located in Westchester County, New York on the Connecticut/New York state line.
- The rig is built on a Mack chassis and is powered by a 350 hp Mack diesel motor.
- The tanker has a 1,250 gpm, two-stage Waterous pump and carries 3,300 gallons of water.
- It is also equipped with 10-inch side and rear dumps.
- Tanker 7 carries a 3,000 gallon portable dump tank.
- Banksville protects the northern area of Westchester County, New York and Greenwich, Connecticut.

Tanker 7 is a older water hauling rig that is set up to function well in both a dump and run operation and a nurse tanker operation.

The tanker is equipped with a 1,250 gpm pump and has the ability to be supplied by 5-inch LDH.

Extra suction hose is always needed in a water hauling operation and Tanker 7 carries 30-feet of 6-inch suction hose.

All of the dumps on this tanker are located on the rear. The rig can dump off of the rear - or the side - through any one of three, 10-inch dumps.

The tanker carries a 3,000 gallon portable tank and some miscellaneous water supply equipment.
