Tanker 62-TA-14 3,000 gal Tanker Bellona Fire District Bellona, New York

Facts & Figures...

- Tanker 62-TA-14 is a 3,000-gallon tanker operated by the Bellona Fire District located in Yates County, New York.
- The rig is a 2008, Pierce tanker built on a Kenworth chassis and powered by a 500 hp Cummins diesel motor.
- It has 8-inch side dumps and a 10-inch rear dump.
- The tanker is also outfitted with 5-inch and 2-1/2-inch direct fill lines and carries a 3,500-gallon dump tank.
- The Bellona Fire District protects a rural area of Yates County in the Finger Lakes Region of New York.



This 2008 tanker can haul some "big water" with its 3,000-gallon tank and dump valves on both sides and the rear.



The Kenworth chassis and 500 hp Cummins motor provide plenty of load carrying capability.



The tanker carries a limited amount of fire fighting equipment – but then again – it is designed to haul water.



Shown here operating at a water supply drill in nearby Seneca County, Bellona's tanker gets filled through its large diameter direct fill line.



The tanker's 10-inch rear dump can offload the water in little time. The rig also carries 1,000-feet of 5-inch hose.
