Facts and Figures...

- Engine/Tanker 2407 is a 2009, M&W Fire Apparatus engine/tanker operated by the Millers Creek VFD located in Wilkes County, North Carolina.
- The rig is built on an HME chassis and has a 1,500 gpm Hale Qmax pump with a Foam Pro Class A/B foam system.
- It is also equipped with 2,000 feet of 5-inch hose and carries a 3,000-gallon portable dump tank.
- This engine/tanker is set-up nicely to serve as either the first-arriving engine or as a water hauling rig.
- The Millers Creek VFD is one of several departments that protect the small towns and rural areas of Wilkes County, North Carolina.

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This engine/tanker is equipped with a Hale QMax 2,250 gpm pump but the rig is rated at 1,500 gpm. It also has no driver side discharges.

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The unit carries a 3,000-gallon portable dump tank on the driver's side..

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Besides the 2,000-ft split bed of 5-inch supply line, the engine/tanker also carries two, 10-ft and two, 18-ft sections of suction hose and has a pre-connected portable master stream device and a pre-piped deck gun.

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ET2407 has a 4-inch, high-flow discharge on the officer's side and carries a full complement of engine company equipment.

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The front bumper compartment is equipped with two, 200-ft, 1-3/4-inch attack lines plus 100-ft of 1-inch forestry hose.



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
