Facts & Figures...

- 18-Tanker-4 is a 1,500 gpm engine/tanker operated by the Plymouth Fire Department located in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire.
- The rig is a 1998, Smeal engine/tanker built on a Freightliner chassis.
- It has a single-stage, Waterous 1,500 gpm Hale pump, a 2,500-gallon tank, and carries 1,000 ft of 4-inch hose.
- The Plymouth FD protects a semi-rural area of central New Hampshire.

This 1998 engine/tanker is set up to function as both an attack engine and a water supply piece. It is one of several such rigs in the Lakes Region area.

The engine/tanker has several pre-connected attack lines, a pre-piped deck gun, and is outfitted to support LDH operations.

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18-Tanker-4 carries a full complement of engine company equipment.

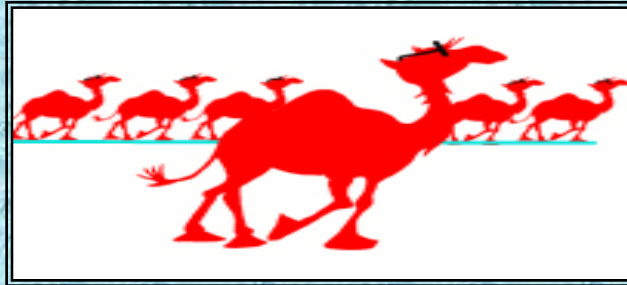


The engine/tanker does not have a dump chute or dump valve but does have a 4-inch direct fill line on the rear of the rig.

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In terms of water supply operations, the engine/tanker is set-up to support a “rural hitch” operation – which is commonly used in the Lakes Region.
