### Facts & Figures...

- Tanker 1321 is a 3,000-gallon tanker operated by the Romulus Volunteer Fire Department located in Seneca County, New York.
- The rig was built by Kurtz Welding on a 1987 Western Star chassis.
- It has a 250 gpm portable pump and is outfitted with a 10-inch rear dump and 4" and 5" direct fill lines.
- Tanker 1321 carries a 2,500-gallon dump tank.
- The Romulus VFD protects a rural area of Seneca County in the Finger Lakes Region of New York.



Tanker 1321's short wheel-base allows for easy maneuvering on winding and narrow roads.
