- 21-Tanker-1 is a 1,500 gpm/2,500-gallon engine/tanker operated by the Tilton-Northfield Fire Department located in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire.
- The rig is a 2006, E-One engine/tanker built on an International chassis and powered by a 400 hp Cummins diesel motor.
- It has a Hale Q-Max. single-stage 1,500 gpm pump and a 2,500-gallon tank.
- The Tilton-Northfield FD protects a semi-rural area of central New Hampshire.



This 2006, E-One tanker is built on an International chassis and carries 2,500 gallons of water.




The tanker carries 15-ft sections of suction hose in addition to some basic engine company equipment.





The rig has a Hale QMax, single-stage 1,500 gpm pump equipped to support the use of 4-inch LDH.



21-Tanker-1 has a 10-inch rear dump and a 4-inch direct fill line which is shown in use at this water supply drill in Ashland, NH.
