Tanker 1621 2,000-gallon Tanker Waterloo VFD Waterloo, New York

Facts & Figures...

- Tanker 1621 is a 2,000-gallon tanker operated by the Waterloo Volunteer Fire Department located in Seneca County, New York.
- The rig is a 1999, ALF tanker built on a Freightliner FL80 chassis and powered by a Detroit diesel motor.
- It has a Hale 350 gpm PTO-driven pump, is outfitted with 10-inch side and rear dumps, and carries a 2,000-gallon dump tank.
- The Waterloo VFD protects a rural area of the Finger Lakes Region of New York.



Tanker 1621 has a short wheel base which provides for easy maneuvering over the narrow and winding roads of Seneca County.



The tanker is equipped with a 350 gpm PTO-driven Hale fire pump to allow the tanker to pump off its water – of course – not as fast as dumping it.



The rear dump arrangement on Tanker 1621 is quite interesting in that it allows for rear and side dumping. The tanker also has a 4" direct fill line.

The 10-inch dumps make the tanker very versatile in water hauling operations.
