# Facts and Figures...

- Tank 6 is a 2008, tanker operated by the Harrison Volunteer
   Fire Department located in Harrison, Maine.
- The rig is built on a Freightliner chassis and is powered by a 360 hp, Cummins diesel motor.
- Tank 6 has a Hale AP-50, 500 gpm PTO driven fire pump and carries 3,000 gallons of water.
- It is equipped with 10-inch side dumps and carries a 2,500-gallon dump tank.
- The Harrison Fire Department, along with several other FDs, protect numerous small town and rural areas in the Lakes Region of Maine.



Tank 6 is a nice, short wheel-based 3,000-gallon tanker whose primary job is hauling water. The short wheel-base makes it perfect for the winding roads of the Lakes Region.



The tanker's 500 gpm PTO driven fire pump allows it to serve in a "nurse-tanker" mode – in a limited capacity –if needed.



The tanker has a large, direct fill line on the rear (4-inch) that allows for a quick turnaround time at a fill site.



The 3,000-gallon tank is a poly tank. The tanker has limited compartment space – but that is okay because its job is to haul water.



Tank 6 is shown here dumping its 3,000 gallons of water at a water supply drill in nearby Casco in August 2012.



Tank 6 is getting loaded here at the same drill. The large, direct fill line helped keep this tanker on the road hauling water.
