

Monona RFD – Tanker 74 1,800 gallon Tanker Monona, Iowa

## Facts and Figures...

- Tanker 74 is a 2004, Monroe tanker operated by the Monona Rural Fire Department located in Monona, Iowa.
- The rig is built on an International chassis and carries 2,000 gallons of water.
- Tanker 74 has a 350 gpm portable fire pump and carries two,
   2,100 gallon dump tanks.
- The tanker is equipped with 10-inch, square dumps on the rear and sides and has dual, 2-1/2-inch direct fill lines on the rear.
- The Monona Fire Department, along with several other FDs, protect small town and rural areas in the sprawling farmlands of northeastern lowa.



Tanker 74's size makes it "just right" for navigating the unpaved roads of Iowa farmlands.



Perhaps the most unique feature of the tanker is its tilting tank. Hydraulic pistons (similar to a tilt cab set-up) raise the tank about one foot which aides in a "faster" offload of water when the tank level gets low..



The tanker is equipped with 10-inch side and rear dumps thus allowing it to offload water very fast.



Tanker 14 is shown dumping water from one of its side dumps at a recent drill in nearby Stanley, Iowa.



Dual, 4-inch hose lines were used at the Stanley drill to fill the tanker.
