

Quarryville Fire Company – Tanker 5-7
3,500-gallon Tanker

Facts and Figures...

- Tanker 5-7 is a 2000, S&S tanker operated by the Quarryville Fire Company in Quarryville, Pennsylvania.
- The rig is built on a Mack CL 713 chassis and powered by a 427hp Mack engine.
- The tanker was refurbished by Swab Wagon Co. (Pennsylvania) in 2011.
- Tanker 5-7 is equipped with a 2,000 gpm pump and carries 3,500 gallons of water.
- The tanker also has two, 10" side dumps and a 12" rear dump all which can be operated from inside the cab.
- Tanker 5-7 is the largest, "big water rig" in southern Lancaster County. The Quarryville FC covers the largest first due area (96 square miles) in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.



Tanker 5-7 is a large capacity tanker set up to operate as a water hauling unit in a tanker shuttle operation or as a nurse tanker in an initial attack operation.



The "business end" of the tanker is equipped with a 12" round dump and two, 3-inch direct fill lines.



The tanker does not carry a dump tank because it often operates as a nurse tanker. The rig is also equipped with two, pre-connected attack lines and a pre-connected, 4-inch discharge line.
